## Personal Emergency Service Pack

✓	Item Required:
	Water filtration equipment
	Flashlight
	Battery-powered radio
	Extra batteries (stored separately)
	Personal first-aid kit (Include gauze bandages and pads, adhesive bandages, soap, antibiotic ointment for burns, and roller bandages.)
	Matches in a waterproof container
	Emergency ration (well wrapped)
	Sleeping bag (or bedroll of two wool blankets) and waterproof ground cloth
	Cook kit and canteen
	Pencil and small notebook
	Handkerchief
	Compass
	Watch (unless you usually wear one)
	Facial tissues
	Work gloves
	Poncho or raincoat (with hood, hat or sou'wester)
	Change of underwear and socks
	Small bag with toothbrush, tooth paste, soap, comb, needle, thread, shoelaces, and toilet paper
	Maps of areas where your troop is likely to serve
	50 feet of No. 5 sash cord or similar-size nylon cord
	Hand ax or belt knife
	Hard hat (bicycle helmet OK)
	Other equipment as determined by weather conditions (winter jacket, rubber boots, gloves, etc.)

## Family Emergency Kit

	<b>Item Required:</b>
	3-day supply of water (1 gallon of water per person per day)
	Flashlight or battery-operated lantern
	Battery powered radio
	Extra batteries (stored separately and rotated regularly)
	Family first-aid kit
	Matches in a waterproof container
	Nonperishable packaged or canned food and a nonelectric can opener
	Blankets or a sleeping bag for each family member
	Eating utensils
	Any special foods or other items for babies, elderly people or family members with disabilities)
	Emergency toilet, if needed (Use a garbage container, bucket, or similar watertight container with a snug-fitting lid; plastic bags for liners; and household disinfectant such as chlorine bleach for odor control.)
	Prescription medications in original packages. (Make sure, however, that all medications are kept up-to-date; check their expiration dates regularly.)
